Therefore, conducting a needs assessment in Islamic education should rely on evidence-based and data-driven evaluations to guarantee that educational planning is relevant, adaptable, and effective. Moreover, this research indicates that Islamic education planning must harmonize Islamic values with modern educational requirements, which encompass technology integration, innovative pedagogical approaches, curriculum relevance, and the enhancement of teacher competencies. The application of causal analysis aids in the formulation of educational programs that are more attuned to societal transformations while upholding the spiritual, moral, and intellectual goals of Islamic education. As a result, causal analysis can function as a strategic framework for enhancing the quality, sustainability, and effectiveness of Islamic education planning in contemporary society.

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
